



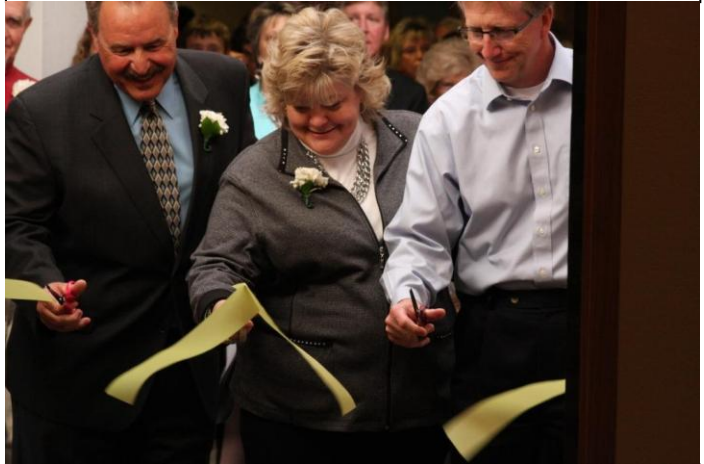

So as we wrap up this Phase of construction, what's next? It's a natural question and one that more often than not gets asked in churches across the land.

While we may not be hammering nails, putting up walls, putting trim, we'll be reading Bible stories, sharing in fellowship, discovering our gifts, feeding the hungry, clothing the poor, and passing on the faith to the next generations.

From the very beginning of Renewing Hope we've talked about that if we settle on Renewing Hope being just a 'building,' we would miss the point.

Phase 1 construction is just a tool for that 'building.' Just as hammers and wrenches are tools, so too are scripture, the waters of baptism, and the bread and the wine of Holy Communion tools for building our faith.

Already has there been beautiful music made within the walls and halls of this place!

And what has made this possible? Well, it's simple. The Holy Spirit moving in and through the people of Lutheran Church of Hope! The Holy Spirit has brought together incredible people of generosity in time, talent, and treasure to make Renewing Hope a reality.

On April 15th we had a party! It was a celebration of thanksgiving and a dedication. We paused amidst our work to give God thanks and to set our place apart once again for the work of God's people. And what a day it was!

So now, the work continues. In the next weeks, we'll be working on landscaping, as well as foundation work for the LCH Columbarium.

We'll also be working on summer ministries together and preparing for the fall ministry year. Note that Rally Day this year is on Sunday, August 19th!

Your Congregational Council will be transitioning to our new model of structure, and ministry teams will begin, transforming our 'church work' into 'faith work.' Get ready to grow in your faith as we continue to share and transform faith, hopes, and lives! The real work of Renewing Hope is now just beginning.

And you know what? I am so blessed to be your pastor. So blessed to be with you on this journey together. You are all in my prayers, and what a sacred joy it is to 'Renew Hope' with you.

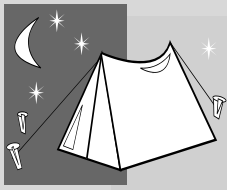

COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARIES

March Church Council Meeting Summary

The meeting was called to order on 3/19/12 at 6:05 pm with one Pastor and fourteen council members present.

Discussion items:

1. Reviewed the procedure for submitting annual committee reports which are due by 4/9/12 in final form to be included in the LCH Annual Report.
2. Listened to the financial report which stated that LCH is at a -\$3500 for the month and at a -\$1089 YTD, however, since we are 2/3 through the year, the budget is on track at 69% of income received and 69% with expenses. Vectra Bank will be paid \$6000 toward our loan.
3. Reviewed the established facility move-in order policy and key issue policy once the Certificate of Occupancy is received.
4. Discussed the status of the next Spiritual Gifts Retreat which may be postponed to the Fall.
5. Announced that a new newsletter editor will need to be chosen to replace Tom Aro. Discussed defining the purpose of all church communication and media methods including the church directory.
6. Announced that the second LCH family campout will be held August 3, 4, 5 at Cutthroat Bay.
7. Announced that Terri Cooper will now be the leader of the Capital Faith Committee as Chuck Meyer will move to the Finance team.

Action items:

1. Finalized the 2012-2013 LCH Mission budget to be presented to the congregation at the Annual Meeting.
2. Designated that the Lenten offerings received will go to the North Denver Cares Food Pantry in Broomfield.
3. Finalized plans for the New Member dinner, Easter breakfast, and Dedication luncheon.
4. Elected Marie Hynek as the third LCH representative to the ELCA Synod Conference.
5. Confirmed the establishment of the Columbarium Team.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer.
